








Survey respondents rated their overall satisfaction with the pedestrian mall on scale of 1 to 5 where 1 was poor and 5 was excellent




Satisfaction varied by section

Percent who agreed the pedestrian mall was beneficial for the downtown as a whole




Percent AGREE or SOMEWHAT AGREE by section






How participants rated the Pedestrian Mall's various features

Duckworth St. (n=10)




If you could make any improvements to the pedestrian mall, what would they be?

The most popular comments were, in order:


- Change Duckworth section (e.g., don't include, allow traffic)

- More public washrooms








Did your business participate in the pedestrian mall by doing any of the following?






Negative impacts (n=17):





Duckworth (n=5):

Duckworth was not pedestrianized in a holistic meaningful way.

Many of our customers are older and distance from parking to store is a major concern.

Taxis can't pickup customers near my business.

I need the parking in the area to make my business work.

We can't afford to have our street closed off.

What would need to be in place for a pedestrian mall to be successful for your business in the future?

Duckworth (n=4):

If there is another Water Street Mall there needs to be a simultaneous unique, well planned, announced, advertised and funded Duckworth Art Walk event...and a big map of where people can find these things.

Parking structure in the east end of downtown.

Open to traffic with no parking except for deliveries.


Move the barricades when the Pedestrian Mall is closed for the evening so I can get taxis to drop off and pick up my customers


Impacts of the Pedestrian Mall
