To seek approval for the planting of landscape vegetation in the floodplain buffer on property located at 18 International Place.

# Discussion - Background and Current Status:

Within an application to construct a Vehicle Storage Yard, the developer has requested to install landscape material along the property where it boarders the Virginia River Trail. There is intermittent growth of trees within the buffer, however, the City requires more plantings to help conceal the commercial development which is visible from the trail system. Trees and sod will be planted in the buffer between the existing security fence and the property line of the Vehicle Storage Yard. These planting, in addition to the required screen fence will mitigate the visibility of the yard from the trail.

The portion of property where the planting will occur is in the Open (O) Space Zone. Landscaping is one of the uses Council can consider in a flood plain buffer under Section 11.2.4(2)(3) of the St. John's Development Regulations. No part of the landscaping will encroach into the floodplain.
