To approve a proposed mural on the front façade of 124 Water Street.

Discussion – Background and Current Status:

The City has received an application for a mural on the front façade of 124 Water Street. The subject property is within the Commercial District of the St. John's Municipal Plan, zoned Commercial Downtown Mixed (CDM) and is within Heritage Area 2.

From the St. John's Sign By-Law, murals may only be permitted upon the recommendation of the Heritage Advisory Committee (now the Built Heritage Experts Panel) and at the discretion of Council. The property previously had a mural on the front façade of the building, however it

was painted over in 2019, therefore the applicant must apply again for the new mural. The proposed mural design is attached.

The mural was reviewed at the November 2, 2022 Built Heritage Experts Panel (BHEP) meeting and the Panel recommended approval of the mural because the façade is already painted. They noted they would discourage against painting over brick, but as the façade is already painted, the mural would have no negative impact on the character defining elements of the building. Staff agree with this recommendation.
