#### Dear City Clerk,

I am writing as a resident of the neighborhood surrounding 10 Blue Jacket Place, where a Discretionary Use application for a home-operated spa has been submitted. My intent is to express concerns about the potential increase in traffic and the consequent safety issues that could arise from the approval of this application, particularly in relation to speed and pedestrian safety during winter months.

With the proposed hours of operation extending from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. on weekdays and up to 3 p.m. on Saturdays, the influx of clients will increase traffic flow within our community. This is particularly troubling as we have long been facing issues with vehicles exceeding the speed limit. The additional traffic drawn by the business could exacerbate this problem, further compromising the safety of our neighborhood.

- 2. Guaranteeing regular and thorough sidewalk clearing during the winter months to ensure pedestrian safety.
- 3. Assessing the adequacy of on-site parking and ensuring that it will not overflow onto the streets, especially during peak business hours.

I am hopeful that these issues can be addressed constructively, allowing for the safe operation of the new business while maintaining the safety of our neighborhood.
