Title: 68 Queen's Road, Window and Door Replacement

Decision/Direction Required:

To seek approval for window and door replacements at 68 Queen's Road, Cathedral Parish Hall Residence.

Discussion – Background and Current Status

The City has received an application for window and door replacements at 68 Queen's Road. The application is only for the portion of the building known as "The Residence" and built in 1893, the year after the Great Fire. The subject building is located in the Institutional (INST) District and Zone, Heritage Area 1 and is designated by Council as a Heritage Building.

Any exterior alterations to a designated Heritage Building require Council's approval. At the May 13, 2019 Council meeting, Council directed that minor maintenance applications for designated Heritage Buildings can be evaluated by staff and sent directly to a Council meeting for Council's approval.

The applicants are proposing to replace two windows at the rear of the building, as well as the entrance door. The windows at the rear are currently single-hung windows that do not meet egress for fire and life safety requirements. The applicants have proposed to replace the windows with two groups of custom-made casement windows, which will replicate the single-hung windows as closely as possible. The windows will be approximately the same size, however a small portion of brick between the windows will be replaced with wood to provide structural support. The stone lintels (horizontal bands above and below the windows) will be protected and preserved. In the past, the City has accepted casement windows which replicate single-hung windows and where these windows are at the rear of the building there are no concerns. The applicants are proposing a three-panel door, which is an acceptable door style for a Heritage Building. Therefore, it is recommended to approve the window and door replacements, as proposed.

Note, Council is currently consideration a rezoning and redevelopment of this property, however, the ongoing amendment application does not impact this renovation application. Restoration of The Residence can occur under the current zone and reflects the desire of the City and applicant to preserve The Residence regardless of future development on this site.
